Canal Walking Group

Following the group's completion of the Leeds-Liverpool Canal Walk last summer we commenced a new project in September 2018. We are now walking the "Cheshire Ring", in easy stages.

The Cheshire Ring takes in the whole of the Macclesfield Canal and parts of the Trent and Mersey, Bridgewater, Rochdale, Ashton and Peak Forest Canals. We decided to start with the Bridgewater Canal and on our June walk we completed this section. Our next walks will be along the Trent and Mersey Canal, which will take us through the Cheshire countryside to join the Macclesfield Canal, north of Stoke on Trent. We expect to complete this section next spring. Each walk is a circular walk with roughly half being along the canal and the return to the starting point being along footpaths, mostly through countryside, apart from at the start of the Canal, where we walked through Central Manchester and Salford. We usually walk six to eight miles once a month so the completion of the Cheshire Ring is likely to take us more than two years, which will give us plenty of time to plan our next project!

Trentham Gardens

A visit to the Trentham Estate has many unexpected delights. In the Gardens there is vast perennial planting programme which changes its colours throughout the seasons so there is always a different display and colour scheme. The immaculate Italian Garden with its wonderful view of the Capability Brown designed lake is a stop, wonder and admire area.
